Regular Meeting to order

Glenn Burns called the Regular Meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. The meeting was held with the following Board Members present: Glenn Burns, Scott Richardson, Jon Kochis, John Smith, and Bill Fagan. Michael Kaper and Tom Brennan were absent.

Also present were Staci Knisley, Ian Coil, Kori Sedmak, Dawn McCoy, Rodney McCollum, and Chris McCoy.

Opportunity for the Public to Address the Board

Kori Sedmak with the Columbus Audubon Society spoke about habitats becoming increasingly rare for grassland birds. She requested to the Board and recommended to delay the mowing schedule in the North Field from May until the middle of August each year. Delaying the mowing would allow the grassland birds to finish up the nesting process.

Dawn McCoy, a resident of Fairfield County also spoke about the grassland birds, such as Savannah Sparrows and other species. She stated that it would benefit our county in many ways to delay the mowing in the North Field. She even has witnessed rare butterflies.

Mr. Kochis stated that it is a requirement of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) that we follow the Wildlife Site Assessment and Recommendations that was approved in 2016. In that plan it has recommended practices such as when grass and vegetation are at 7 inches, we are to mow. The Board also has a Vegetation Management plan contract to remove vegetation. They plant hay and remove it per our contract. This is also a part of the Wildlife site Assessment and Recommendations.

Mr. Kochis stated that inside the Area of Aviation (AOA), HAS mows based on AOA guidance through the FAA.

Mr. Kochis stated it might be possible for our contractor can find a solution to maintain the vegetation and delay the mowing while following the FAA guidelines.

Mr. Kochis stated that ground nesting also creates predators. The higher the vegetation discourages the predator. He will post the Wildlife Site Assessments and Recommendations on the Airport's website.

Ms. Mcoy asked that we all that we all do our parts for the pollinators and birds. She asked for consideration of the Board to delay the mowing in the north field area.

Mr. Kochis stated that the two (2) Vegetation Management Contracts coming up could be discussed for changes.

Ms. McCoy stated that the OSU Airport maintains an area for the upland sandpipers.

Mr. Kochis also stated that the 25-year plan is to develop the north end of the Airport.

Dr. Burns asked for Ms. McCoy and Ms. Sedmak's contact information. The Board will investigate.

Ms. Sedmak also stated that there are small grants available from the Columbus Audubon Society for seed, feel free to email her.

The fuel pumps are working, the counters are working also, it is just the screen that is not working to use the credit cards. They have a NOTAM up that fuel is unavailable if unattended by management.
