Regular Meeting to order

Glenn Burns called the Regular Meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. The meeting was held with the following Board Members present: Glenn Burns, Scott Richardson, Jon Kochis, Michael Kaper, John Smith, Tom Brennan, and Bill Fagan.

Also present were Staci Knisley, Al Moyer, Steve Griffin, Ben Riggs, Ben Cooley, and Ian Coil.

Opportunity for the Public to Address the Board

Mr. Ben Riggs stated that the work that was completed where the old road was taken out appears to have a dip or hump. He thinks there could be an accident on an overrun due to the hump.

Mr. Kochis stated that the project was required to get the approaches back. Visually it may look like a dip, but it is level with the runway. There is a slight grade towards it until you get to the wall. That is the extent of the runway safety area that the FAA requires. We are meeting their requirements. To continue to further in that area, we are moving 9 feet of dirt. It would be 100's of thousands of dollars and it would cost more to move the utilities again. We already paid \$250,000 to move the Utilities. There is always the risk on an overrun, but the approaches are deemed safe. We have some ability to shave a little bit of the hump off the top to the right towards the pipeline. We have exceeded the grant funding to go any further. It will require local dollars to shave some of it off. The Airport is meeting the FAA's guidance and design.

Mr. Coil stated that he still believes that it could be a problem but knows there is always risk.

Mr. Kochis will do some research to see if the dip can be shaved off more.

Approval of the Minutes for the October 14, 2024, Meeting

On motion of Jon Kochis and second of Michael Kaper, the Fairfield County Airport Authority Board voted to approve the minutes from the October 14, 2024, meeting.

<u>Fixed Base Operator (FBO)/Airport Management update with Sundowner Aviation – Monthly Board Report</u>

a. Monthly Report

Mr. Coil reviewed the FBO Monthly report with the board; see attached to minutes.

b. FBO transfer G2 lease to G3

Mr. Coil asked the board if a transfer would be allowable between the hangars. The FBO, Sundowner Aviation is currently in Hangar G2. The only benefit is that the Gorsuch Hangar has a lot of traffic which is across from Hangar G3. There is no difference in the sizes of the hangars. This would accommodate the new tenant.

The board had no objections.

c. Fuel Machine

Mr. Coil stated that the fuel machine was fixed but another thing has broken. It should be fixed this week. The new software is working well.

d. Research for hangar prices

Mr. Coil presented a sheet of hangar prices nearby; see attached to minutes. He reported that every one of these airports are fully occupied. They have 2-4 people on their waitlist. They have a lot of turnovers.

Airport Improvement - Jon Kochis & Tom Brennan

a. Engineer's Summary Report - Crawford Murphy Tilly, Inc. (CMT)

Mr. Cooley reviewed the Engineer's Summary report; see attached to minutes.

Master Drainage Report

CMT is preparing a scope and fee for the North Development Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) project.

Discussion of FY2026-FY2035 ACIP 10-year plan

Mr. Kochis reviewed the FY2026-FY2035 ACIP 10-year plan; see attached to minutes.

Mr. Kochis reported that FAA call on November 6 related to our ACIP did not go as well and we may need to rethink our 10-year plan. The FAA did not like the box and commercial hangar projects on the list since our waiting list is mainly for T-hangars and we are a general aviation airport.

Mr. Cooley stated that the FAA will not support any northern development projects at this point.

Mr. Kochis stated that he anticipates continuing conversations with the FAA.

Mr. Kochis reviewed the Setterlin layout for the construction fence; see attached to minutes. They anticipate their plan will be approved with a start date of November 18.

Mr. Kochis stated that the LOMR is a FEMA process. A hydrological study must be completed for the LOMR. The costs for this are \$77,000 out of local operation costs. The study will take 18-24 months.

Mr. Cooley stated that the study could reduce the environmental costs.

Mr. Kochis asked the Board to review. He recommends that this eventually the LOMR gets approved.

b. Storm Water System Repair

• Quarterly Stormwater Visual Inspection Report

The Board reviewed the report.

c. Master Plan/Hangar Build

Mr. Kochis stated that all 4 new commercial hangars have tenants that have verbally committed. He will start the lease process with those potential tenants. The pricing for the new T-hangars is something that the Board needs to establish soon. The return on investment (ROI) could take longer due to the pricing from a major metro study. The original ROI was \$425 per month with an annual increase built in.

Mr. Kochis recommended that the first thing the board needs to decide whether we need to let the waiting listees have first pick of the new hangars or do we allow current tenants to move.

The board discussed options on rent for the new hangars and on current hangars. No decision was made.

Mr. Brennan recommends that the Board take all the information and continue discuss at a later date.

Dr. Burns stated that we table this discussion and in January put a subcommittee together to discuss hangar rent prices.

Community Relations - Michael Kaper

Nothing new to report.

Facilities and Grounds - Bill Fagan & Michael Kaper

Mr. Kochis reported that the sealcoating between parking area in Hangar A & B did not get completed. There was a car in in the lot. This work is tabled to the spring. There is \$1,000 left on the contract and the purchase order will need to be carried over until June of 2025.

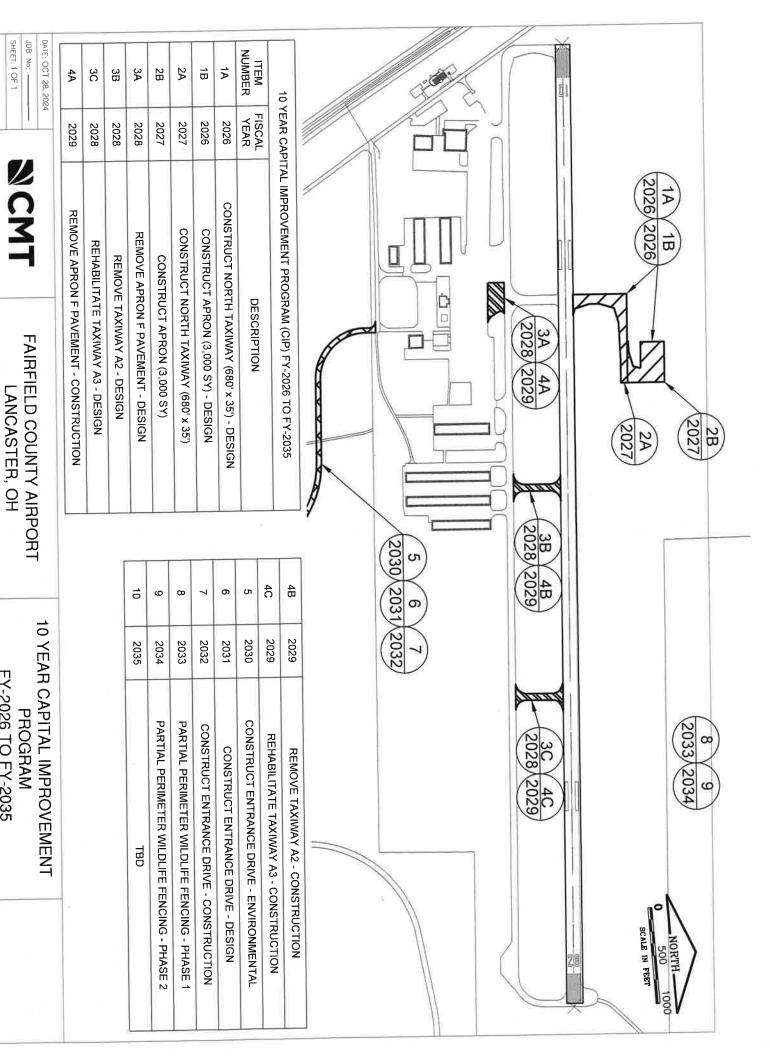

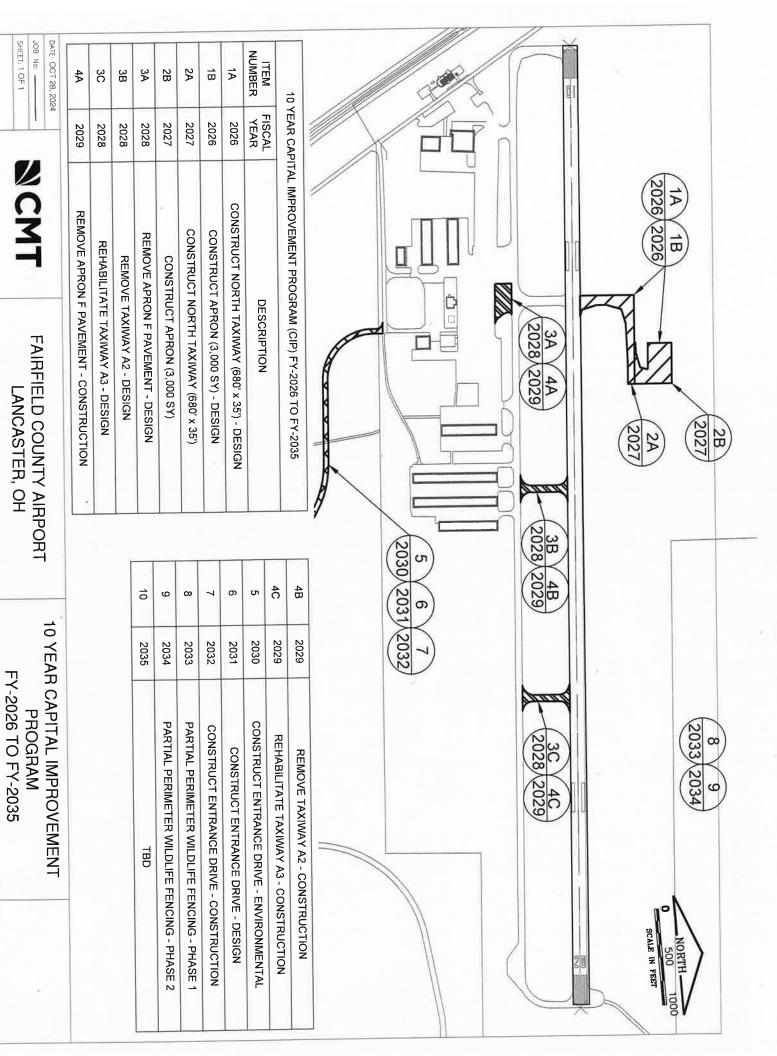

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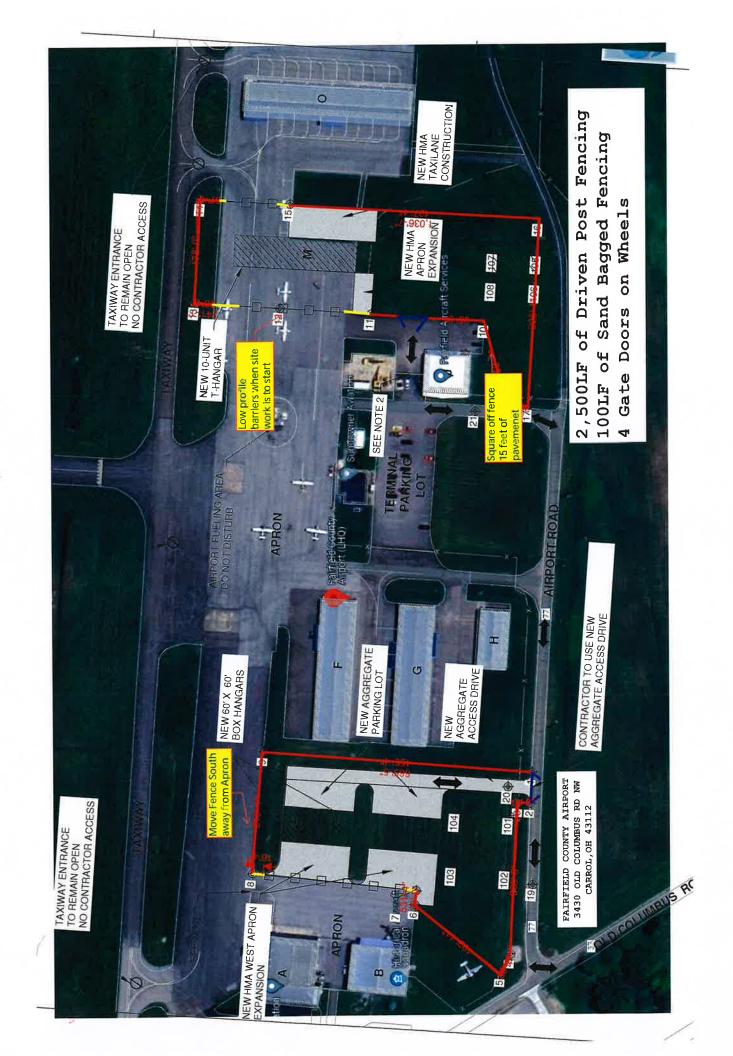
FY-2026 TO FY-2035

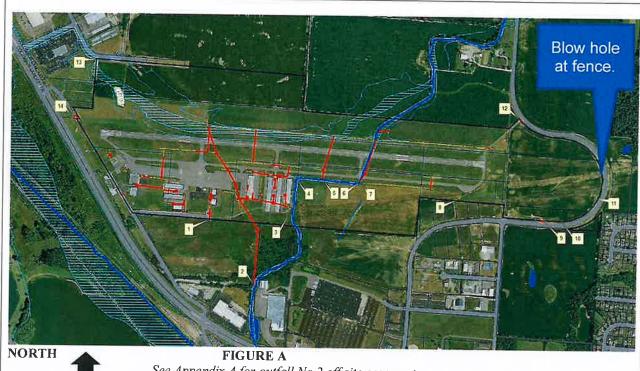

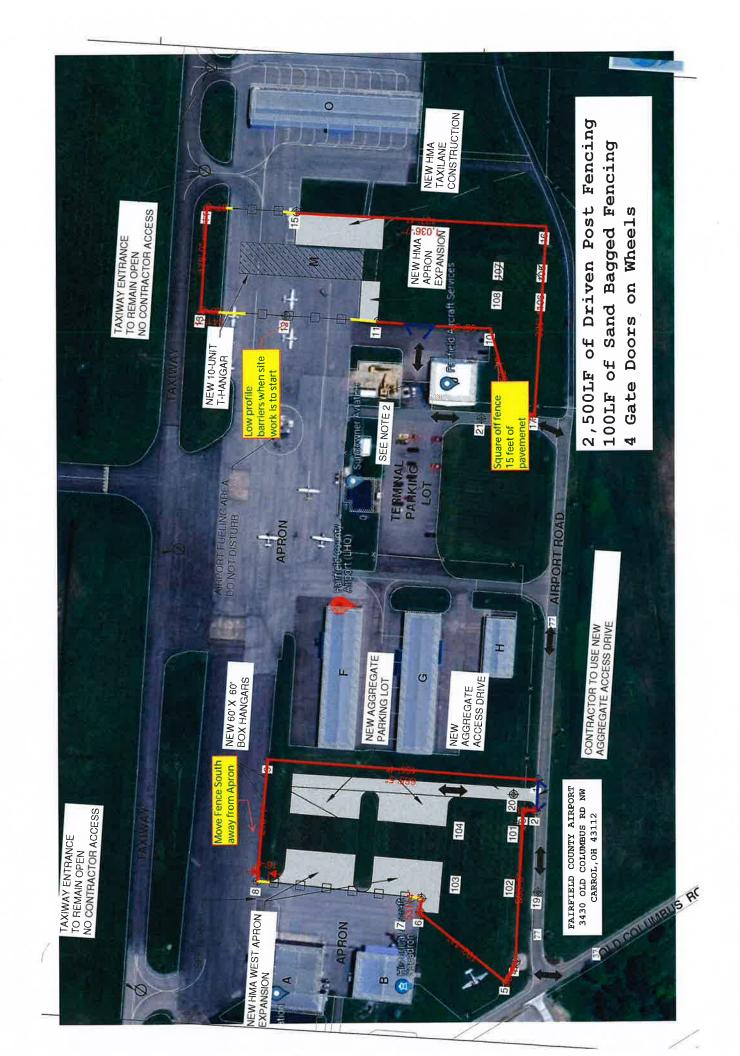
Attached you will see the layout for the boundaries of construction and how it will impact the Apron. I have asked for the C hangar area to be adjusted so the fence is not on the Apron.
